









## Cellular Alarm Instructions iPhone only

**IMPORTANT: FIRST PAIR YOUR IPHONE WITH YOUR IWALLET FOLLOWING THE BLUETOOTH PAIRING INSTRUCTIONS IN THE USER'S MANUAL. BEFORE YOU CONTINUE, MAKE SURE THAT YOUR IPHONE HAS THE OPERATING SYSTEM 4.0.1  
IF IT DOESN'T, DOWNLOAD TO YOUR IPHONE AT:**

- 1) Open Safari  on your iPhone screen
- 2) Go to [www.jailbreakme.com](http://www.jailbreakme.com)
- 3) Slide iPhone lock to jailbreak\*\*
- 4) Close window and look on the iPhone's screen for the "Cydia" icon 
- 5) Open Cydia and press MANAGE on the bottom of the screen
- 6) Press SOURCES in the middle of the screen
- 7) Press EDIT (in blue) in the upper right hand side of the screen
- 8) Press ADD (in blue) in the upper left hand of the screen
- 9) A window will appear to add a URL. Type: <http://apt.bigboss.us.com/repofiles/cydia/>
- 10) Search for iWallet
- 11) Download I-Wallet alarm
- 12) The iWallet icon  will appear on the screen
- 13) Go back to Cydia  icon on the screen and open
- 14) Search for BACKGROUNDER app and download it in order to have the iWallet app running in the background of your iPhone
- 15) Once downloaded is completed, you should have the BACKGROUNDER icon  on your screen
- 16) Go back the iWallet icon  and open
- 17) Hold the lower center button (home button) on your iPhone for 2 seconds and the message *backgrounding enabled* will appear
- 18) Close iWallet app; your iPhone alarm is now activated

**The iWallet and iPhone alarms will now sound if both devices are separated by more than 20ft\* from each other**

**ALARM DISABLING: To disable alarm on the iPhone, hold home button for 2 seconds and the message *backgrounding disabled* will appear**

\*distance greatly varies according to environment

\*\* A jailbreak is simply the ability to run apps not available at the Apple store. Jailbreaking doesn't slow down your device or use any extra battery... A new DMCA exemption was approved by the Library of Congress July 26, 2010, specifically allowing jailbreaking.
